From the Rector's desk:

We are now in harvest season - when we give thanks in our churches for the harvest and for God's creation. These last couple of weeks I have seen fields around my house being ploughed and then drilled with new seed for next year's harvest; and it is always a comfort to know that food production has started its cycle again.

However, we know that many in our area are struggling to put food on the table, so we would be very grateful for foodbank contributions to our harvest services that we can donate to either the Gatehouse Foodbank or the Vineyard Foodbank. Just bring your donations to the service and we will drop them off to the appropriate foodbank.

Harvest is all about growth! You may have wondered about the logo that is being used on Reaching Out these past few months - it's a bunch of grapes - and it is a logo that until recently has been used by the 'Leading your Church into Growth' organization. It is a scriptural reference to the vineyard, as in John's Gospel the vineyard represents Christ, who is the "true vine" and the source of life and spiritual fruit for believers, who are the "branches". So, you can see that it is a symbol of growth and that we long to grow more branches - and be fruitful! If you feel that you would like to know more about the Christian Faith as part of LYCIG there are already opportunities in our benefice to do so. We have a men-only group and a women-only group that gather regularly to study the bible and discuss what it means to live as a Christian today.

It was great to learn that 18 people had answered the call to serve God in a lay ministry, and to see them being licensed by Bishop Graeme (our acting Diocesan Bishop). I pray that they will have a fruitful ministry in the parishes they will be serving, and that many more are called to train as a lay minister in our diocese in the future.

Big Green Challenge for October

The current which brings warm water to the west coast of the UK (often called the North

*

Atlantic Drift) is in danger of being turned off within the next 100 years a study has concluded, making deep cuts to fossil fuel emissions even more urgent to avoid the catastrophic impact. Scientists have warned previously that the collapse of the current must be avoided "at all costs". It would shift the tropical rainfall belt on which many millions of people rely on to grow their food, plunge western Europe into extreme cold winters and summer droughts, and add 50cm to already rising sea levels.

According to Prof. Stefan Rahmstorf, at the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research in Germany, "We found that the tipping point where the shutdown becomes inevitable is probably in the next 10 to 20 years or so. That is quite a shocking finding and why we must act fast in cutting down emissions."

Air temperatures are rising rapidly in the Arctic because of the climate crisis, meaning the ocean cools more slowly there. Warmer water is less dense and therefore sinks into the depths more slowly. This slowing allows more rainfall to accumulate in the salty surface waters, also making it less dense, and further slowing the sinking, forming the feedback loop.

Politicians need to be made aware of the alarming situation that we could face because of this change in sea currents. With political parties talking about increasing fossil fuel production and moving away from net zero targets, all of us need to be campaigning to raise public awareness of the dangers of continuing to burn fossil fuels.
